(VESTAL, NY) – United Way knows that hunger is a pervasive problem. Right now, in Broome County over 26,490 individuals are food insecure. It could be your neighbor, your colleague, your friend. 52% of children enrolled in the Broome County public school system are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch. The demand for emergency food has grown as inflation has increased with the food we distributed doubling from over 350,000 meals in 2021 to over 625,000 meals in 2022.

Together, with Broome County Hunger Heroes, United Way of Broome County announces the 2nd annual *Full Plate Project*, a community-initiative supporting the Annual Community Campaign. *The Full Plate Project* works to ensures vital food insecurity programs are funded and available to those in need.

"As it has done for over 100 years, United Way has conducted an Annual Community Campaign to ensure vital health and human service programs are funded and available to our families, friends, and neighbors.
