United Way of Broome County Announces Grant Program Recipients

(VESTAL, NY) United Way of Broome County is pleased to announce the 2019-2020 Grant Programs recipients. Through various non-profit funding opportunities within United Way of Broome County, including the Basic Needs and Strategic Priorities Grant Program, the Capacity Building Grant Program, and the Healthy Lifestyles Coalition (HLC) Grant Program, over \$1.9M in funds, raised through the 2018-2019 Annual Community Campaign and United Way of Broome County resources, were approved by community volunteers to assist 38 local non-profit organizations with 72 projects and programs.

BASIC NEEDS AND STRATEGIC PRIORITIES GRANT PROGRAM

The Basic Needs and Strategic Priorities Grant Program focuses on critical issues with the goal of making progress through collaborative, coordinated efforts. Together, we work with funded community partners to identify solutions to our community's strategic priorities that address core issues in the areas of health, education and financial stability and focus on three Strategic Priorities:

CAPACITY BUILDING GRANT PROGRAM

The Capacity Building Grant Program was established as a means to provide financial resources to strengthen the ability of community partners to effectively and efficiently respond to these challenges and opportunities. The Capacity Building Grant Program provides funding to support and strengthen local not-for-profit agencies through capacity building and capital projects.

HEALTHY LIFESTYLES COALITION GRANT PROGRAM

The Healthy Lifestyles Coalition (HLC) is providing funding to programming that advocates and encourages the adoption of healthy lifestyle behaviors. These funded projects and programs are dynamic, creative and data-driven interventions that promote physical activity and socialization, create a safe and clean environment, and support the social, emotional and mental health of all youth, individuals, and families.
